This booklet...

- It is a tool to work on the issues of peace education, and submit proposals which have been experienced in the various primary schools in Cairo and in other countries around the world.
- It is developed within the experience of a working group of teachers, who
 try to respond to the need to spread the experiences related to peace
 and solidarity, to promote an exchange, a debate on these issues,
 starting right from life and from the lived experience.
- It is organized into four thematic units of work which follow the same scheme: starting with the presentation of an educational experience, from reflecting on it ideas are derived, proposals are made, work tools are available, some of which directly usable by children, others with the mediation of the teacher.
- From the methodological point of view, the work takes the form of active notebook because it:
 - does not provide prefabricated answers, but open questions
 - proposes experimentation and research together
 - enables the class to work together effectively
 - allows each student to be involved in the first person
 - helps to share, evaluate experiences, learn together
 - non-splits relationship- method-content.
- The teacher may use these materials in the manner he/she deems most appropriate, modify, adapt, rework them and if he/she wants to share with us his/her experience kindly fill in the form that you will find at the end of the file.



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Peace is not a value that is given: it is a value that we must learn in order to know, that we have to experience on our own skin, we must include in everyday behavior, in small and large acts of love that are done under our eyes.

The great value of peace, however, is a value that cannot be taught like any other school subject: it is a value that we must live inside and transmit around us, a value that we have to understand and learn to recognize in things and faces, in the difficult moments but also in the joys of everyday life; it is something that we have to make ours, in the depths of ourselves.

Practicing Peace is an exercise of life that involves us with our family (being "peaceful" in the relationship with our parents and brothers),

that passes for our emotional relationships (be friends even with those who do not care about us), that lingers in our schools (to be positive in the group of our class), and that is with us in every place we live.

Being men and women of peace is a great challenge, is a "nice" challenge, however, made difficult by a world that seems to deny all our good intentions.

However, the experience that was condensed in this publication entitled "Living Peace" is an experience built up day after day with the patience of someone who knows how to give value to time, and to expectations, and has seen actively engaged hundreds, thousands of children, teenagers, youth, parents and teachers, someone who can comfort us and communicate to us a sign of hope and optimism.

These pages tell us that it is possible to "educate for peace", and saying this, I want to emphasize the semantic value of the word "educate ", which in its root means" to lead ", but also" walk together ", walking side by side.

It 's a beautiful image of two or more people walking together, they educate each other, help each other to grow: it is the image of the school as it should

be, (a place where adults and children, students and teachers go together to discover a new world every day), how to be a family (a "cell" in which we will exchange experiences and affections), of how our society should be '(a cohesive body, peaceful, open, supportive, enjoying peace with himself and with others).

I hope that all those things will not be a nice dream that tells only your games, your designs, your thoughts, your stories and your fairy tales, but rather a living experience that should cherish and hold dear.

INTRODUCTION

Working for a peaceful future is to work for peace in the present moment.

n a context marked by increasingly precarious conditions, loss of ideals, prevalent individualism, homogenizing globalization, with multiple negative consequences on the level of interpersonal, intercultural, interfaith, and international relationship, we firmly believe in the need for a **pedagogy of peace** based on the tie of coherent theory and practice, principles and actions, values and experiences.

We call to the world of school and, through it, to all expressions of the community, from families to institutions that perform functions in various capacities important in the socio-cultural-political-educational aspects.

Convinced of the transversal nature of the education, which - being a "go to the best "- implies co-responsibility, widespread in the research and development for a common improvement; we propose the following basic directions of a possible shared commitment:

- emphasize the importance of personal testimony ("peace begins with me") as the dimension of the teaching profession open to world of values
- assign particular value to the interpersonal relationships and community building, such as coexistence of diversity in dialogue, as a dimension not closed and self-centered but open to a confrontation with the other, and with other ethnic-culturalpolitical reality

- in the comparison between the different theoretical approaches, highlight the positive dimensions that unite us and seek to share in order to make "our best" (without neglecting the critical analysis of what denies the rights of people and communities
- further research on peace education, valuing the multiple contributions that come from important witnesses and researchers, making us treasure the experience gained at local and international level ...


Other students from many countries around the world will participate with a Skype connection and video messages to testify their same commitment of building peace.




